2. Courses given at Avery Point may be offered only in alternate years to assure sufficient enrollment. Therefore, it is necessary for students to plan what courses they want to take prior to their 5<sup>th</sup> semester.
3. Prior to registration for the fifth semester, each student will need to become informed about the offerings planned for the next two years, to plan the course choices and best plan of study for the fifth through eighth semester.
4. The Coordinator will initiate a record of feedback from the students about the appropriateness of the related area courses to assure the above list is up to date and reflects the best course choices.
5. It is possible to get other courses to substitute for courses on this list with approval from the student's advisor or the Coastal Studies Coordinator.
